Dear Mr. Night wander:

I would like to update the Commission with respect to the application of WCPFC and IATTC conservation and management measures to U.S. fishing vessels in the area of overlap between the two organizations. Specifically, the area of overlap includes the waters bounded by 150° and 130° W. longitude and 4° and 50° S. latitude.

In accordance with the joint decision of the WCPFC (paragraph 80 of the report of WCPFC9) and the IATTC (Resolution C-12-11), the United States has initiated the rulemaking process necessary to decide which of the two organizations' conservation and management measures will be applied to U.S. fishing vessels in the area of overlap, as well as to apply them accordingly through regulations. We anticipate the rulemaking process to be completed in 2015 and will inform the Commission when the U.S. regulations are in place. Until rulemaking is completed, the U.S. government will continue to apply the management measures of both organizations to U.S. fishing vessels in the area of overlap, as appropriate.
