**ANNUAL REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE WCPFC DATA ACCESS RULES
AND PROCEDURES**

WCPFC-TCC19-2023-RP08
11 September 2023

Paper by the Secretariat

Purpose

1. This paper provides an update on WCPFC's non-scientific data holdings and their administration.

Introduction

2. The rules categorising data as public or non-public, and the administration of that data is governed by the [Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of Data Compiled by the Commission](#) (2007 data RaP).
3. There are additional rules for non-scientific data holdings in the [Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of High Seas Non-Public Domain Data and Information Compiled by the Commission for the Purpose of Monitoring, Control or Surveillance \(MCS\) Activities and the Access to and Dissemination of High Seas VMS Data for Scientific Purposes](#) (2009 MCS data RaP). Non-scientific data holdings are summarised in **Annex 1**¹.

Access to WCPFC data holdings

Accessing public and non-public domain data

4. Access to public domain data is through the WCPFC webpages and more recently via Application Programming Interface (API) where possible. However, some data requests for more detailed, typically scientific data are received. These are actioned on a case-by-case basis where the information is not available from the WCPFC webpages.
5. The Secretariat has an established system for the case-by-case review and approval of requests for access to WCPFC non-public domain data. All approved data request review forms, correspondence requests and a record of released data are kept in the Information Management System. The Secretariat recognises the need to improve CCM's ability to manage their data requests and timely access to data, particularly given the number of requests now being made. Improved access to VMS data through a TrackWell API has been available for a couple of years. In 2023, an API giving access to transshipment data

was developed and trialed and is now a potential option for CCMs. The Secretariat intends to also consider opportunities to also improve the transparency and speed of the processing of data requests.

Who has access to data

6. The 2007 data RaP categorises those who have access to WCPFC data that is necessary to perform their duties as:

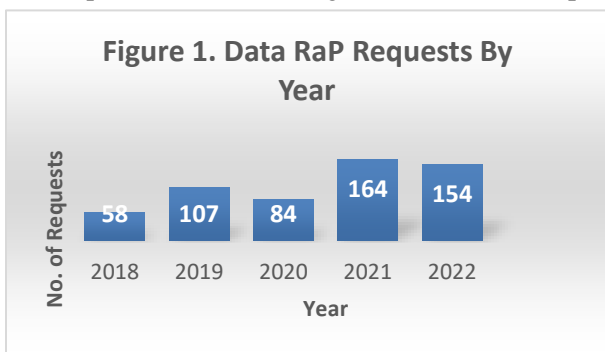
- i. WCPFC Secretariat and Service Providers authorised by the Executive Director; and
- ii. Officers of the Commission and its subsidiary bodies.

7. A register of access to all WCPFC non-public domain data is maintained by the Secretariat.² The register records the Secretariat staff positions, Service Providers and any other individuals that have access to this data (refer to **Annex 2 A**). The Secretariat also maintains records of access to individual Commission systems (refer to **Annex 2 B** for a summary of access during 2022/2023). A list of all CCMs that access the WCPFC VMS system is shown in **Annex 3**.

8. Secretariat staff and those individuals working with the Secretariat for short periods, such as interns, are required to sign a confidentiality agreement. Service providers have a confidentiality agreement as part of their contract with WCPFC.

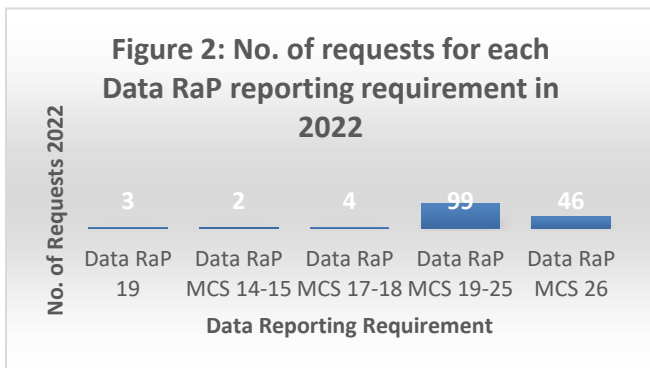
Numbers and types of non-public domain data requests

9. **Figure 1** below shows an increasing number of approved data requests since 2018, with 164 and 154 requests received during 2021 and 2022, respectively. While the level of requests in 2020 was less than in 2019 it was still higher than in 2018. The 2020 figure reflects the effect of COVID-19 on the level of operational MCS activities, particularly port/landing inspections and High Seas Boarding and Inspections.



10. **Figure 2** shows that in 2022, 64% of requests were for VMS data (MCS data RaP 19-25) and 30% for transshipment reports (MCS data RaP 26 of 2009)³. Around 40% of requests seek access to multiple non-public domain data sets, principally VMS and transshipment reports. Detailed information

11. Anecdotal information indicates the effect of the conditions arising from COVID-19 on ‘in-person’ inspection activities added impetus to CCMs using new technology and analytical tools to enhance risk assessments, operational planning and the monitoring of vessel activity. In turn, this has increased the use of WCPFC data.

12. The Secretariat has also noted an increase in the data requested to support port State reviews

of port entry applications and inspections. This will be driven by the increased emphasis on applying port State related measures by Pacific Island port CCMs, some of whom are or are intending to be signatories to the UN Port State Measures Agreement. During 2022, requests from two CNMs for non-public domain data were denied, as the data rules do not currently allow for CNMs to have access.

13. Since 2022, the Secretariat has been assisting members to become more familiar with the rules and processes for requesting WCPFC non-public domain data through online training. Short guidance will be prepared in early 2024 to support this work with members.

CCMs Annual Reporting on their implementation of MCS data RaP for 2022

14. Annual Report Part 2 for RY2022 included a review of CCMs implementation of MCS Data RaP paragraph 44. CCM responses in 2021 and 2022 were similar. Just over half indicated they have implemented the obligations with the remainder indicating it is not applicable as they do not request data.

Administrative Notes

15. The WCPFC webpages available through the CCM Portal gives details of each CCMs Official Contacts. These Contacts are used to assess the authority of those requesting access to non-public domain data. It is important that CCMs ensure the information is kept up to date to reduce potential delays in processing their requests.

16. The Secretariat intends to identify opportunities to improve CCM's ability to manage their data requests and to ensure timely access to data. While improvements to how VMS and transshipment data are accessed have been achieved, the Secretariat will consider opportunities to improve the transparency and speed of its review and processing of data requests.

Recommendation

17. TCC19 is invited to note the report on the administration of the WCPFC data access rules and procedures.
